£1 per cake and I was averaging £50 per bake sale

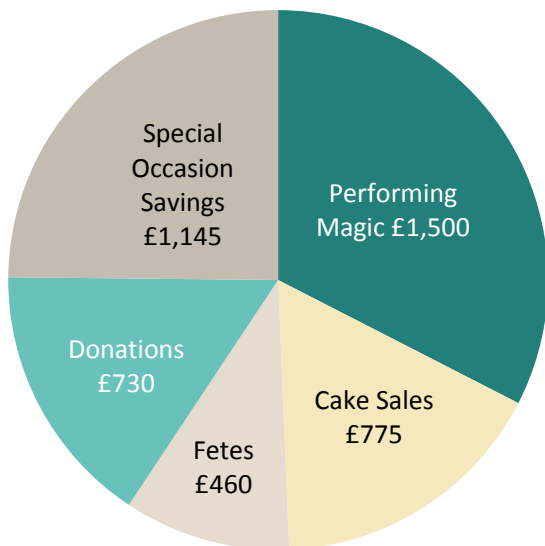
£460 Fetes

Top Tips

1. Make a monthly forecast of planned events and expected income
2. Keep a weekly record of amounts raised to crosscheck with your monthly forecast to make sure you're on track
3. Get advice from previous World Challenge participants
4. Use school breaks to sell cakes if you can
5. Spread fundraising throughout the week
