## **Non-Uniform Days - Paying Through WisePay**

Ashlyns School runs three non-uniform days throughout the year, for a voluntary donation of £2 for each day. All funds raised are divided equally between our designated school charities - more details below.

A number of parents have expressed a preference for a one-off donation, rather than having to remember to provide their son/daughter with the correct change on the day, and it also avoids the risk of forgetting completely, or students losing the money. In our ever-growing cashless world, and to maximise the amounts raised that we can pass on to worthy causes, we are giving parents the option to pay for non-uniform days via WisePay, **as a one-off annual donation of £6.**

The schedule of non-uniform days for the current academic year is as follows:

Friday 20 December 2019 - Save the Children Christmas Jumper Day for (jumpers are optional)

Friday 13 March 2019 - Sport Relief

Friday 17 July 2019 - The Swan Youth Project

Donations of £6 should be made by WisePay by Thursday 19 December. For those students whose parents do not make the one-off annual payment, a £2 cash payment will be requested on each non-uniform day.

This contribution is voluntary, however if insufficient funds are raised we may need to reconsider our current opportunities for non-uniform.

Our charities for 2019/20 offer support to those in need locally, nationally and worldwide:

- Save the Children - protecting children, giving them a healthy start and the chance to learn
- Sport Relief - supporting vulnerable people and communities in the UK and internationally

- The Swan Youth Project (Berkhamsted) - supporting young people by providing an environment in which their personalities and life skills can be developed, enabling them to become contributing individuals of society.
