# 1. Update from Mr Shapland

This week has been one of various announcements regarding education - the most significant probably being the guidance for the way in which all children will return to school, full time, in September.

Before I outline some of the key measures, the most important thing I want to say is that I believe this is the right ambition. The Government has said, 'Returning to school is vital for children's education and for their wellbeing' and I could not agree more. We want all our children back - learning, interacting with friends and being part of a wider community.

Clearly, the safe return to school for everyone needs to be undertaken in a way which mitigates risk and the guidance published yesterday offers detailed advice on the actions we are expected to take, whilst also expecting schools to make some adjustments and decisions based on their own particular context. Further details about what this means for Ashlyns will follow in due course, but in short the key principles are listed below:

- All years groups are expected to return but that they will, as much as is possible, remain in year group 'bubbles' avoiding contact between groups where this can be achieved
- Classrooms will need to be arranged to minimise face to face contact e.g. with forward facing desks
- Staff will be required to maintain distance from pupils and other staff as much as possible
- The curriculum should be broad and balanced and should not be narrowed except in very particular circumstances
- Mitigations should be in place to minimise risk of transmission (although this is not the same as social distancing in the community.) This will include prevention measures including robust hygiene practices such as more frequent hand washing
- Enhanced cleaning measures should be put in place for frequently touched items/surfaces
- Strict procedures are to be followed regarding anyone displaying symptoms and/or testing positive for the virus and their contacts.

In other news, we have also received several updates about public examinations. The most significant one for our current students is the consultation on proposals to adapt GCSE and A level examinations in 2021 to reflect the lost teaching and learning time due to school closures. The plan is that these will go ahead - maybe slightly later than usual and with some possible changes to content and assessment in some subjects. Finally, for all the talk of the importance of returning, it is also important for us to recognise the successes of remote learning that parents/carers and students themselves have helped us deliver. With your support there have been some very significant achievements and - while we need to put in place a recovery curriculum to address the gaps in children's learning we should remember to celebrate these.

I am fully aware that the September return will not be a 'return to normal' but we hope to make it as 'normal' and as welcoming as possible and I know that our students will rise to the challenge of helping us make this work.

# 2. Face-to-face sessions

We are looking forward to seeing Year 12 in school next week for their face-to-face sessions on Post-18 options. The sessions will cover all aspects of university applications, including: choosing courses and institutions, the UCAS application process and how to write a personal statement. Students will also gain an overview of how to use the Unifrog platform for planning their next steps and have access to support and advice about careers options, apprenticeships and vocational courses.

Well done to Year 10 who received more in-school face-to-face tuition in Maths and Science this week, alongside outdoor wellbeing and academic progress sessions; we are looking forward to seeing those targeted students who have been scheduled for the coming week.

# 3. Remote Learning

A really successful Sixth Form Induction Day was held on 30 June as a virtual experience. Videoed assemblies, speeches by the current Head Boy and Head Girl, Form Tutor introductions and subjects taster sessions were all prepared and shared with our Year 11 students through google classroom and external students through our website. Feedback from students was really positive:
