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## 1. Update from Mr Shapland

This week, Ofcom released figures to show that UK adults spent a quarter of their waking hours online during lockdown with seven in 10 people making video calls at least once a week. It concluded that most people have 'sought new ways to keep connected, informed, entertained and fit' and the pandemic has 'radically changed our online behaviour.' I'm sure that, up and down the country, we will have all appreciated the irony that our children's deep understanding of online communication tools turned out to be a significant bonus!

This got me thinking about how much of our normal summer activity has changed - but also how much we have managed to maintain - during this period - through the power of virtual tours, meetings and activities ... and yet we know it is not 'quite the same'. Having filmed messages for new Year 7 and new Year 12 induction days, I gave the same message - I can't wait to see them in person ... and that is true for all students in all year groups.

On which note, it seems we have a date for this 'school reunion.' In last week's message, I mentioned that we had no prior warning of Government updates and heard it at exactly the same time as everyone else. As the T-Bulletin was landing in in-boxes last Friday, many of us were perhaps watching or listening to Gavin Williamson announce that schools will be open for all pupils in September.

This is good news. However, at this moment in time, we are all holding our collective breath - waiting for the guidance (due by the end of next week) to give us some ideas of the parameters and expectations of reopening for all students. The Prime Minister spoke of the country coming out of 'hibernation'. Of course, our students have not been hibernating, they have been working hard, engaging and participating at a distance - but care and careful planning will be needed to support this 'return.' We will keep you informed over the next few weeks.

Last Friday also brought news of a £1 billion 'catch up' fund. Any new funding in education is very welcome and, once we know what we may receive, we will work hard to target it for maximum impact; we need to make sure our children do not keep hearing the message that they are somehow deficient or lagging miles behind where they should be. This period has also allowed them to demonstrate so many skills and we owe it to them to be optimistic. As I completed my Yearbook message to our 2020 leavers, I expressed the hope that those students leaving us this year will hold onto the memories and successes of their entire 5 or 7 years at school - and not just the last few months.

And finally, being optimistic and positive - this week's mini heatwave has brought home to me that there are a few things I have not missed about 'normal school' in the summer months ... namely students complaining it is too hot, the slightly uncomfortable heat of the Hall at the summer concert (although the fabulous music makes up for it) or the concern about shade, dehydration and sunscreen on Sports day. It seems every cloud...

### **Train Track Trespassing Awareness**

### **County Lines**

We are increasingly warned and are aware of so-called 'County Lines' groups operating within our local area. These are gangs and organised crime networks which groom and exploit children to sell drugs or be involved in their distribution; with children as young as 7 years old targeted. Please click here for a [link to the Children's Society's website](#), which includes signs for parents to watch out for, and [support for parents](#) who are concerned: parents should especially be alert for the following signs which may indicate increased risk of their child being exploited:

- Returning home late, staying out all night or going missing
- Being found in areas away from home
- Increasing drug use, or being found to have large amounts of drugs on them
- Being secretive about who they are talking to and where they are going
- Unexplained money, phone(s), clothes or jewellery
- Increasingly disruptive or aggressive behaviour
- Using sexual, drug-related or violent language you wouldn't expect them to know
- Coming home with injuries or looking particularly dishevelled
- Having hotel cards or keys to unknown places.
