#### Face masks and the environment

We have continued to speak to students this week about the environmental impact of disposable, single-use face coverings. Please encourage your child to invest in or make their own reusable, washable face coverings, and ensure they bring a spare to school. It is not sustainable for the school to provide these items.

#### **Chrome Book Use**

Please ensure students charge their chrome books each evening ready for use the following day.

#### **Crutches**

If students need to use crutches when in school please advise the school as we need to carry out a risk assessment and give them access to the lifts.

#### Meal Tokens

If your child needs to borrow a meal token for £1.80, please ensure this is paid back the following day either through Wisepay or direct to the Finance Office.

#### **Lunch Cards**

Should your child lose their lunch card, they must let Student Reception know immediately to suspend the card. This will ensure no money is spent. A new card can then be purchased for £1.00.

#### Cold/Wet Weather

We have today allowed students to keep coats on, given the cold wind. This will be reviewed on a daily basis, so students should monitor weather forecasts and layer-up underneath uniform as appropriate.
