# **The Hygiene Bank Collection**



The Hygiene Bank was started in 2018 by Lizzie Hall, when she became aware of hygiene poverty in the UK. Since its humble beginnings, it now has 766 hygiene product collection points throughout the UK and has recently partnered with Boots at 245 of their stores nationally. They weigh all their donations and currently have a total of 316,617kgs of products distributed since Hygiene Bank began.

We are partnering with Northchurch Baptist Church to collect items for the Hygiene Bank. The Hygiene Bank collects new, unused and in-date toiletries, hygiene basics, beauty and personal care and household cleaning essentials. Please see suggestions of items below. These are not exhaustive; if you need them and use them, then it is likely someone else needs and uses them too. Please do not donate half-used, old products.

# Female

Period products, shampoo & conditioner, hair styling products, face wash, cleanser and creams, body wash, body lotion, deodorant, toothpaste & toothbrush, disposable razors, nail files, make-up, perfume, gift sets.

# Male

Shampoo & conditioner, shower gels, deodorant, disposable razors & shaving foam, toothpaste % toothbrush, hair & styling products, nail clippers, men's grooming products.

# **Baby/Child**

Nappies & pull ups, night-time pants for older children, baby wipes, barrier cream, toothpaste & toothbrush, baby wash, baby & kids shampoo, talcum powder, nit comb & nit shampoo.

# Household

Washing powder, household cleaning, plasters, hairbrush, hair ties, loo roll, tissues, ear buds, wipes.
