# Safeguarding(1): MeeToo App for iOS and Android

<u>MeeToo</u> is a recommended, multi-award winning, free, anonymous app where young people can talk about difficult things. Built on research showing the positive impact of peer support for mental health, MeeToo provides a safe, pre-moderated space for young people aged 11+ to experiment with opening up about whatever may be on their mind. Posts can be responded to by other users, as well as a team of trained university psychology students and MeeToo counsellors who help to guide discussions and ensure that no post goes unanswered. **Moderators check every post and reply before they go live** to ensure the safety and anonymity of users, and counsellors uphold a sophisticated system for monitoring and tracking potential safeguarding risks. MeeToo supports over 6,000 young people each month. It is featured on the NHS Apps Library and promoted by more than 1,000 schools in the UK. You can easily see how MeToo works here.



# **Dr Kathy Weston - Tooled Up education**

In response to a question we were asked, this week, we've made a <u>tip sheet about Snapchat</u>. We often feel under pressure from our children to download particular apps or social media platforms and Snapchat is one that they seem particularly drawn to. In fact, recent IPSOS MORI data found that in the UK, 71% of internet-using 13-17-year-olds go on Snapchat. We also know that its light-hearted visuals and 'disappearing' messages make it very popular with younger children, despite its recommended minimum age of 13. If your child wants to download Snapchat, check out what you need to consider and download our checklist of things to discuss with them before they do. Making sure that your children become critical consumers of online content is crucial. Luckily, the *Tooled Up* library is full of evidence-based resources and activities focused on cultivating digital literacy, for parents and young people of all ages. Log into the site and browse the <u>Digital Life</u> category to find out more.

You'll also find two new podcasts on *Tooled Up* this week. Our timely interview with criminologist Professor David Gadd focuses on the culture of violence against women and girls and domestic abuse, within both adult and teenage romantic relationships. Particularly in light of the Everyone's Invited campaign, it's important for us all to consider the most effective ways to teach our boys (and girls) about good relationships and how to best examine issues of consent and boundaries. Listen here (or read the accompanying notes) for his expert advice and keep your eye on the site for more resources about body boundaries, coming very soon. Our other new <u>podcast is with Dr Naomi Flynn</u>, a leading expert in supporting multilingual children in the classroom (and their families). This is a particularly important issue, given that over 20% of children in UK schools, from very diverse circumstances and backgrounds, speak a language other than English at home. Listen for clear advice for both teachers and parents. If you are interested in multilingualism, and its huge benefits, also check out our podcast with Oxford University's <u>Professor Victoria Murphy</u>.
