Update from the Headteacher

Parents/Students

Further to the announcement made by the Prime Minister earlier this week (Step 3 of the roadmap) I can confirm that, from Monday 17 May, students will no longer be required to wear face coverings in classrooms or in communal areas at school.

I'd like to thank everyone for the way in which they have adapted to the various safety measures over the past few months. Whilst we have all understood the need for these additional precautions, this latest change will allow for better communication and more natural discussion. I know that students and staff will welcome this step towards a more normal school life.

I would, however, like to stress that those students who wish to continue to wear a face covering will be able to do so for the remainder of the term and we need to be prepared to adapt should the guidance change in response to particular localised situations.

I would also like to emphasise the importance of continuing to adhere to the other safety measures, which remain in place until further notice. The updated risk assessment can be found <u>here</u>.


