Covid Testing and Reporting

Sadly, case rates continue to rise in the UK, and Hertfordshire is no different. Please do not send children in if:

- They have any symptoms of Covid-19 (a new, continuous cough, change or loss of taste or smell, a high temperature) – in this instance you must book a PCR test
- They have been identified as a close contact and/or asked to self-isolate
- If they are generally unwell, including colds, headaches and runny noses –
 it's better to be safe than sorry

It is important that students and staff continue to take twice-weekly Lateral Flow Tests to help reduce the spread of the virus. Please continue to report positive, negative and void LFT results to both NHS Test & Trace and the school via the online form. If the result of the test is unclear (void) you should do another test.

We encourage all parents and carers to take regular tests too: you can order online, collect from a pharmacy or visit a mobile testing site, view your options at: www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/rapidtest. If you test positive using a rapid test you must book a confirmatory PCR test at: www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. Your whole household must begin self-isolating immediately.

Great Behaviour for Learning

We are delighted at how many students have received zero behaviour points since the return from lockdown in March and May half term. Overall, nearly 600 students have zero behaviour points for the entire year! On top of this, in excess of 130,00 merit points had been awarded up to May half term - an average of almost 120 per student. Well done all!



Safeguarding

- (1) Review of sexual abuse in schools and colleges. Last week's <u>letter to parents</u> provided information about the Ofsted review of 30 sample schools, which listed findings in those schools such as:
 - issues around sexual abuse and harassment are "so widespread that they need addressing for all children and young people"
 - for some young people, sexual abuse and harassment is so commonplace, that they see no point in reporting it
 - online sexual abuse is prevalent and group chats are a problem
 - sexualised and homophobic language is common
 - Nearly 90% of girls, and nearly 50% of boys, said being sent explicit pictures or videos of things they did not want to see happens a lot or sometimes to them or their peers.
 - 92% of girls, and 74% of boys, said sexist name-calling happens a lot or sometimes to them or their peers.

Whilst we continue to gather information from our own student focus groups, we would also urge all parents to have discussions with their own child(ren) around this topic.
