Attendance reporting procedures - to speed up the process of recording morning daily absence, and ensure we have accurate records of symptoms, we are now asking parents to report children's absence by 0830 each morning using our <u>online google form here</u> which will be added to the website.

Safeguarding

- NSPCC Image Remover. The NSPCC have introduced a new Report Remove tool whereby children, young people and adults can report nude images of them that are circulating on social media and ensure they are taken down. The tool can be accessed <u>here.</u>
- 2. Parent drivers. If you bring your child to school by car we ask that you please drive carefully and respect local residents. It is vital that the area remains safe so students are not placed in danger due to inconsiderate driving. Concerns have been expressed by police and residents that some cars are inappropriately parked across driveways, blocking pavements or even on residents' properties. Congestion would be eased and the safety of students better assured if parents who need to collect their children waited further from the school site. If you do travel close to the site via Chesham Road, please ensure you park only on the school side of the road, and not in the turning circle.


