

Stakeholder Survey

As you may be aware, at the end of the last academic year, all stakeholders (staff, parents/carers and students) were invited to complete a survey to give their views on a range of topics. The findings of the surveys have been summarised in this letter to parents/carers. Thank you to everyone who completed a survey.

Safeguarding

(1) Social Media and Gaming Research

We are working with a team of researchers from the University of Leicester, UCL and Anglia Ruskin University who are conducting government-funded research on young people's experiences of gendered, sexual risks and harms online during COVID-19. The online survey is for young people aged 13 to 18 years old and takes approximately 20 to 30 minutes to complete. The questions ask students about their experiences of using social media and gaming platforms during COVID-19, and their experiences of online risks and harms

In order for your child(ren) to participate, they must first have a parent sign the consent form which can be found here along with brief information about the purpose and use of data gathered. Students would complete the survey at school with a school staff member present.

(2) Online Safety

Apple have a handy Guided Access feature. It effectively keeps the phone or tablet locked on one app – so if you say 'yes' to a quick game of Angry Birds, for example, then *that* is all a child will be able to do on your device. For more information please click <u>here.</u>
