Safeguarding

- (1) Following several incidents of students reporting being approached by a stranger on their journey to school, the driver has been identified and spoken to by the police. Well done and thank you to the vigilant students who reported this to us. Please contact the police if you have any further concerns via 101.
- **(2) County Lines:** young people are being exploited, but it's not always obvious. The Children's Society have launched their #LookCloser campaign, developed in partnership with the National County Lines Co-ordination Centre and British Transport Police, and encourages everyone to learn the signs of child exploitation and how to report it.

Parental communication with school

As a school, we have very high standards in all aspects of school life. Pivotal to those standards is the Behaviour Policy put in place by the Governing Board. Staff have a duty to apply that policy fairly to all students and should a student not meet the standard, we ask that parents work with us as outlined in our Home-School Agreement. We thank parents for being courteous and respectful at all times and refraining from using confrontational or aggressive language when you talk to us on the telephone, in reception, or at the front of school. 
Volunteers
