Safeguarding

1. Our evidence-informed work on strengthening a culture of gender equality and reducing harmful sexualised behaviours online is already well advanced this year. This week, a detailed report on youth-based experience of imaged-based

sexual harassment and abuse was released, containing recommendations for professionals and parents. It recommends that parents should:

- Avoid taking an overly negative and disciplinary approach to your child's technology use
- Be non-judgemental and supportive towards your child's online activities. •
- Initiate open conversations with your child about the sending of nude • images and problems that can ensue.
- Initiate conversations with your child about their social media usage and • privacy settings
- Support your child's understanding of consent, bodily autonomy, equality • and ethical decision making.


