Year 11 Study Sessions

We have been delighted with the take up of our subject specific study and revision sessions for Year 11; these have been very well attended this week. We appreciate your support in continuing to encourage students to do at least one study session per day, either lunchtime or after school, as part of their daily two hours of home learning or revision. Home learning should always be completed first, and the remaining time should be made up (or added to) with revision classes or independent study. The subject study sessions timetable can be found here and Session 6 runs every night except Friday in the LRC, with the addition of a Session 7 until 5.20 on Wednesdays.

Year 9 Options

Our Year 9 students will soon be choosing their GCSE options. To help inform these choices in the lead up to our virtual Options Evening on 10 February, students are using Unifrog, our online careers destinations platform, in tutor time. Unifrog has a vast library of resources relating to different careers and university choices, and is extremely easy to navigate. It's a very useful resource for students to use at home as well as in tutor time to research particular careers and courses.



Safequarding

The Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza DBE, has recently published a guidance document for parents helping to support them to understand online sexual harassment. It is a sensitive topic, and not one all parents feel comfortable discussing with their children.

The commissioner's team brought together a group of 16 - 21 year olds and asked them to talk about what they think parents should know, and what they should say to their children when talking about sexualised bullying and the pressures of growing up online.

Key advice from the young adults in the focus groups included:

- Start conversations early, before your child gets a phone or social media account. Keep the conversation going over time, adapting to your child.
- Young people want their parents to learn about new technology and trends, including risky behaviours and dangerous spaces online.
- Create a safe and trusting home environment. Young people told us the home environment is key, they want to share things with their parents but don't always feel able.
