Safeguarding

We are seeing a surge in popularity in students using apps, games and platforms to 'find friends' since the start of the pandemic. The way that young people use online spaces continues to involve and now more than ever, it is essential to understand the risks that some of the emerging 'friend-finding' apps pose.

Wink

This app is linked directly with Snapchat, allowing users to exchange profile information. Once a user has exchanged their details, their conversations continue on Snapchat. Wink's Terms of Service require users to be 13+ but there is no effective age verification and anyone can re-enter a fake date of birth until they gain entry. Some may be familiar with the function of 'swiping right' and 'swiping left' – found in popular dating apps, including Tinder. The premise is simple: swiping right expresses interest in chatting further and swiping left moves to the next user. In any case, this function is based on finding others to chat with.

There are limited privacy and safety settings. Users cannot restrict who can contact them and there is no

option to make an account private, but they can block and report users. Wink users often include sexual themes and references to alcohol and other drugs. To address this, the platform uses technology to scan for inappropriate images.





This is a very similar app to Wink as it directly links to Snapchat, allowing users to exchange usernames and friends', 'make new allowing continue conversations to on Snapchat. It again has ineffective age verification. 'Age gating' means adults can't see profiles of users under the age of 18, and vice versa, but users can edit their age at any time. Users can report photos but NOT other users.



Discord

Discord is a very popular free online platform (owned by Amazon) that hosts voice, video, and text chat. It was founded in 2015 by two friends who wanted a better way for gamers to connect with each other whilst on-line gaming.

Discord's simple design is especially appealing to

children and young people. However, this creates a prime environment for someone with harmful intentions to easily build rapport with a young person based on similar interests. Risks can include sexual exploitation, Inappropriate or illegal content, lack or privacy settings and harsh or inappropriate language and bullying.

Message from Hertfordshire County Council

Ahead of February half-term, we'd like to say thank you once again for continuing to play your part and for helping to keep yourselves and others safe from COVID-19.

If you're travelling abroad this half-term be sure to check and follow COVID-19 guidance for your country of travel and on re-entering the UK, you can find the latest travel guidance <u>here.</u>

Get vaccinated - vaccination continues to offer the best protection for ourselves and others around us from becoming seriously ill from COVID-19.

There are lots of walk-in options available locally for first, second doses and boosters, you can find your nearest vaccination centre and also book an appointment <u>here</u>.

Young people aged 12-18 yet to receive their COVID-19 vaccination(s) don't need to wait for a visit to their school or setting. You can find out more, including walk-in options for clinics for young people, and book <u>here.</u>

Half term COVID-19 'Relax and Vax' sessions for nervous teenagers

Five of the larger vaccination centres across Hertfordshire and West Essex are running 'Relax and Vax' sessions during half-term week aimed supporting 12 to 18-year-olds who are nervous about having their COVID-19 vaccine.

Specially trained staff will be on hand to help overcome worries like a fear of needles and answer any other concerns using simple and clinically effective relaxation techniques to help reduce tension and support them through the process. Children aged 12-15 need to be accompanied by a consenting parent or carer and just mention they're nervous on arrival so that the staff can make adjustments and they're given plenty of time and support.

People under 18 who have recently had COVID-19 must wait 12 weeks before having their vaccination.

- Test regularly 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 don't display symptoms. Regular rapid testing at home can help to prevent transmission. Find out all the ways to get home test kits (LFD tests) at: <u>www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/rapidtest</u>
- Stay at home if you have symptoms stay at home and book or order a PCR test online at: <u>www.nhs.uk/get-tested</u>

Please do not send children and young people back to school following half-term if they have any symptoms or feel unwell. There continues to be a high number of outbreaks across Hertfordshire's childcare, nurseries, schools, special schools and colleges – they need your support to help protect our communities and have the least disruption to children's learning and development as possible.
