The escalating conflict in Ukraine and the devastating consequences for its citizens have been shocking to witness and our thoughts are with all those affected - including family members in the UK.

Like many communities, we want to support the humanitarian effort and find ways to practically support those in Ukraine and those displaced by and fleeing from the conflict.

To this end, the funds raised by the planned activities listed below (and collections) will be donated directly to The Disaster Emergency Charity (\underline{DEC}).

The DEC brings together 15 leading UK aid charities to raise funds quickly and efficiently at times of crisis overseas. The DEC and their local partners are in Ukraine and in neighbouring countries providing food, water, shelter and medical assistance and therefore the school's focus is to direct fundraising to this important, coordinated effort and to support the scaling up of emergency support.

In this way, our school community will be able to play a small part in the global response to the conflict in Ukraine.



What are 'county lines' and Child Criminal Exploitation?

County lines is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks who bring drugs into an area and sell them using dedicated mobile phone lines. The perpetrators are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults to move and store drugs and money and they will often use coercion, intimidation, violence and weapons.

Children as young as 12 years old can be exploited or used by gangs to courier drugs in and out of their local area; 15-16 years is the most common age range. Both males and females are at risk of being exploited. Social media is often used to make initial contact with children and young people.

Criminal exploitation can be broader than just county lines and can include children forced to commit theft or take part in sexual activity. The victim may have been criminally exploited even if they appear to be taking part consensually. This useful <u>handout</u> has more information for parents and carers.
