World Challenge

A group of Year 13 students travelled to Ecuador this summer on a four week World Challenge expedition. The trip saw the students hike in the Andean Mountains across paramo grasslands and the ecologically diverse cloud forest as well as summiting the Pasochoa volcano at an altitude of 4200m above sea level. The team took part in a community project on a sustainable eco-farm, Rio Muchacho; they built pathways and foundations as

well as taking care of animals and contributing to life on the farm. A highlight of the trip was the excursion to Isla de la Plata where they saw the unique blue footed boobies, snorkelled with sea turtles and spotted humpback whales. 
