## Year 8 Activity Days

On 17 and 18 July we have two activity days and I have planned the following exciting days of team building, competition, navigating and timekeeping, helping both reward students for their efforts this year as well as promoting resilience and character:

### Monday 17 July – Sports Activities

We have arranged for 'It's a Knockout' to take place in the morning, when students will experience team races and the strong possibility of getting wet with water and foam! Afternoon team building activities and sports to complement the morning. Students will need PE kit and a change of clothes on the day

### Tuesday 18 July – Chessington World of Adventure

The theme park includes ten themed lands and over forty rides and attractions, together with a zoo, sealife centre and daily shows. Each land offers a unique theme, rides, attractions and places to rest and shop. The zoo hosts over one thousand animals, from the exotic and endangered to the cuddly and cute. We recommend students bring a packed lunch on the day but there will be an opportunity to purchase drinks, small snacks and souvenirs. Please bring a change of clothes if you plan on going on wet rides.

We will be travelling by coach, leaving school at 8.15am and returning at approximately 6.00pm. Students should register in the Chapel at 8.00am. They will **not** be expected to wear school uniform for this trip.

The total cost for all these activities will be £40.75. This includes travel, insurance, admission to Chessington and It's a Knockout. For those students who have a valid Merlin Pass the total cost will be £22.50. For more information on the Merlin pass please information [here](#). It is the student's responsibility to bring and look after their pass on the day. Please note that Blue Peter badges are no longer accepted at Chessington. Payment should be made by ParentPay by Tuesday 2 May at the latest.

A full risk assessment has been undertaken for the above activities and appropriate control measures are in place.

Please note that the school's policy is that trips and other activities outside the normal teaching programme should be self-funding. Contributions are voluntary, but if these are insufficient the trip/activities may have to be cancelled. No student will be denied participation in the trip/activity because of difficulty in meeting the cost.
