

Congratulations to Ben B, in Year 11, who successfully completed his first solo flight on his 16th birthday. This is the youngest age you can fly a light aircraft on your own.

Congratulations to Ella and Sophia, in Year 8, who have won Pearson's "Twist on a Tale" writing competition, this year focusing on diversity and representation in literature. Ella and Sophia's illustrated story "No Such Thing as Normal" follows characters Echo and Lizzie and their experiences in school as non-binary and neurodivergent.
