**Attendance reporting procedures** Please report children's absence by 08:30 each morning using our <u>online google form</u> which can also be found on the school website. This form should also be used to report future absence e.g. dentist appointments.

## Safeguarding

This <u>short film</u> was recently published by Financial Times Films, and gives an important insight to the impact of social media on children and family life. The video can help support parents/carers on how they talk to their children about their social media use.

#### **Behaviour and Uniform Reminders**

Students' behaviour and uniform standards are very high at Ashlyns; in order to maintain this, from Monday of next week, we will be reinforcing uniform and behaviour expectations in tutor time with students. We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers of the <u>uniform expectations</u> as per our school website. Some key expectations and reminders will be as follows:

- In the event that your child has just had new piercings and this amounts to more than a single stud they will be asked to remove them and these will be placed in a named envelope at Student Reception to be collected at the end of the day. The student's Standards Card will be signed. Clear ear studs and nose studs are allowed
- In the event that gel nails are present, one day's grace will be given for removal. This will also result in a C3 detention.
- Hooded jumpers are not allowed to be worn on the premises (with the
  exception of the school PE hooded jumper during PE lessons), including at
  break and lunchtime. Should this be the case then the jumper will be
  confiscated and placed at Student Reception for students to collect at the
  end of the day and the Standards Card will be signed.
- In the event that a student is wearing trainers they should have a 'trainer pass' or a note from their Head of Year giving them permission. Should they not have one of these then they will be asked to wear plimsolls for that day. Should this be the case then their Standards Card will be signed. Please see details of expectations and examples of school shoes
- You will already be aware that students should not have mobile phones visible during the school day. Should they be wearing earphones or air pods during the school day these will be confiscated and placed at Student Reception until the end of the day. This will also result in a C3 detention.
- Eating or drinking is not allowed in school corridors. This would result in a Standards Card signature.
- At break or lunchtime students should be on their allocated playground/field/canteen area or in the LRC. Should they be in any area deemed out of bounds, for example, another year group's toilet area or playground/field area, a C3 detention will be given.



<u>Autism Conference Recordings</u>: If you missed our autism conference, don't worry! We have uploaded all of the conference talks to the library, with topics ranging from the latest research to insightful experiences. The topics of the conference day are split into different resources to make it easier for you to find the information you need.

Nitrous Oxide Quick Guide: Nitrous oxide, also known as laughing gas, is the third most commonly used drug according to NHS data. However, this lighthearted nickname belies the harm that this drug can cause. That's why we have developed a quick guide in conjunction with the DSM Foundation to provide parents and carers with essential information about nitrous oxide. The guide also signposts to further sources of information for those who want to learn more.
