Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to a new school year from all of us at Ashlyns. I hope that you had a good summer and that your children are looking forward to the year ahead. I would particularly like to extend a warm welcome to our new Year 7 students and those joining us in the Sixth Form for the first time; we wish them a very happy and successful time at Ashlyns and look forward to getting to know them all.
