#### School Travel

Following our communication last week regarding our collaboration with Hertfordshire County Council to reduce speed limits in the school's immediate and surrounding areas, we would like to highlight another opportunity to comment to Dacorum Council who are looking to identify walking and cycling routes of most importance to the community over the next 10 years. The aim is to make these routes more attractive and viable options than using a car. One of the primary routes highlighted includes Chesham Road, where it can be suggested that crossing points, verge cutback and improved lighting would be beneficial.



Supporting Your Child Through Friendship

It's Valentine's Day, and the topic of relationships is in the air!

Even from an early age we can set our children on the path to healthy and happy relationships throughout their lives. We can help them consider how they relate to others, beginning with brothers, sisters and friends. Perhaps they want to <u>celebrate their sibling</u> or use our friendship <u>quiz</u> to think about what makes a good friend? In our <u>podcast</u> with Professor Robin Banerjee, he discusses the fascinating connections between peer relationships, kindness and wellbeing.

Being a good friend means respecting boundaries, which is why we produced this <u>resource</u> for young pupils to learn about body boundaries. At the other extreme, we explore 'rough and tumble' play in this <u>podcast</u> with Professor Peter Smith and Dr Jennifer St George, and the surprising role it plays in developing resilience and emotional intelligence.

In terms of future-proofing children, we want them to develop strong relational skills as they grow and develop. For starters, we can model and encourage them to be emotion scientists rather than emotion judges. Learn about this approach in our <u>podcast</u> with Professor Marc Brackett, and use this <u>resource</u> to draw younger children's attention to these concepts. From the primary school years, we can host strong foundational chats about our bodies, ensuring that our children understand how their bodies work and have good information around appropriate touch. If you are unsure where to begin, try these <u>Ten Tips for Parents</u> or tune into this <u>webinar</u> on the importance of such conversations.

For the parents of teens, friendship challenges, dating dilemmas and distinguishing between healthy and

<u>unhealthy relationships</u> are normally top priorities. As teenagers grow into themselves and find their place in the world, friendship difficulties are common throughout adolescence. Our brand new <u>resource</u> offers a template for supporting your child through friendship problems that can build a teen's confidence.

Valentine's Day offers us a chance to talk about love in general and to talk about what it isn't. We have a host of material within Tooled Up by cybercrime expert, Dr Lisa Suguira on topics such as online gender based <u>violence</u>, revenge <u>pornography</u>, and the growth of online <u>misogyny</u>.

As parents, we are important role models for the interpersonal relationships that children form. Sustaining connection is the topic of choice in this <u>webinar</u> with relationship therapist Sue Wintgens. For those considering separation, Dr Reenee Singh provides some useful tips <u>here</u> to minimise any impact on children.
