Artificial Intelligence

Generative artificial intelligence (AI) tools have become increasingly widespread and easily accessible. Many staff, pupils, and parents/carers may already be familiar with popular generative chatbots like ChatGPT, Google'sGemini and Snapchat AI ('My AI'), as well as other tools like Google's Bard, DALL·E for image generation, and voice synthesis applications.

Last week, Mr. Grant and Mrs. Kirk led an assembly focused on the responsible use of Al. They highlighted the benefits and risks of these tools and emphasized the importance of understanding and critically evaluating the information encountered online.

We encourage all students to approach AI thoughtfully, to question the reliability of the content they interact with, and to consider how they can use these tools responsibly while staying safe online.


