Filming with Victoria Collins MP and Channel 4

Today, we were delighted to welcome our local MP, Victoria Collins, and a Channel 4 film crew to Ashlyns as part of her *Safer Screens* tour. Year 11 and Sixth Form students took part in a filmed discussion on the impact of smartphones and social media on mental health and well-being.

Victoria Collins highlighted that this is one of the biggest issues she receives correspondence about from constituents, making our students' perspectives even more valuable. They were fantastic throughout: thoughtful, articulate, and insightful in sharing their experiences and viewpoints.

The segment, which will offer a glimpse into parliamentary life, is set to air in May on Channel 4. A huge well done to all the students involved!

Character

Our Year 10 Prefects continue to impress in delivering the Character Programme to Year 7 and 8 students during tutor time, fostering meaningful discussions and development.

- Year 7 have begun a new unit called Being Determined, focusing on resilience, perseverance, and the mindset needed to overcome challenges.
- Year 8 have started Saving for the Future, which explores delayed gratification, the importance of saving, and the character strengths of self-regulation and patience needed to achieve long-term goals.
- Year 9 are engaging with Good Speech, a unit that encourages students to reflect on how communication can be virtuous or harmful, helping them develop thoughtful and respectful ways of speaking.
- Year 10 continue to use the VESPA programme, developing independence and self-regulation as they progress through their GCSE journey.

Our Character Programme remains at the heart of our pastoral curriculum, equipping students with the values and skills they need for success in school and beyond.

Year 11 Raising Achievement Programme

Our Year 11 students continue to impress showing real dedication to their studies. Attendance to revision sessions has been excellent with many students attending multiple sessions throughout the week.



This Saturday marks Zero Discrimination Day 2025. Founded by the United Nations, it promotes inclusion and equality in all UN member countries, and the right of everyone to live a full and productive life.

The day highlights the need to combat inequalities of all kinds; gender, age, health status, sexual orientation, race and class.

At Tooled Up, celebrating diversity is a key part of our work with parents and schools. Our **resources** are **aimed** at encouraging acceptance and helping children understand themselves and the different groups in the world around them.

If your child hears or experiences prejudicial language, are they equipped to challenge it? We share tips in Supporting Your Child to Step Away From and Challenge Harmful Talk in Their Peer Group. This resource also includes useful advice for parents whose children are using denigrating language towards groups of people.
