Sixth Form Dress Code

Students who elect to join our outstanding Sixth Form are committing to adhere to our dress code. Students should take pride in their appearance and wear clothing that is suitable for a formal, professional environment.

Students are given the independence to make choices about their clothing, but this must be in line with the compulsory elements of the dress code.

The leadership of our Sixth Formers is a real source of pride at Ashlyns; looking smart and professional is one way students are role models to their younger peers.

Suit

• Comprising a tailored jacket with either tailored trousers, a tailored skirt or tailored dress.

Worn with

- Shirt and tie, or blouse
- Smart black or brown shoes or smart ankle boots with a sensible heel. No other form of footwear may be worn
- Jumpers must have either a round neck or 'v' neck; cardigans may also be worn. Roll-neck jumpers
 must not be worn, as a blouse, or shirt and tie must be visible at all times. Hooded tops and sweatshirts
 must never be worn
- A Sixth Form lanyard must be worn and visible at all times.

Additional Information

- Only ear piercing is permitted; no other facial piercings are allowed
- Hair should be neat, a natural colour and not outrageous in style
- Garments made of stretch fabric, t-shirts, vest tops, jeans, jeggings, leggings, shorts/culottes or chinos must not be worn
- Denim and leather jackets/trousers/skirts must not be worn
- Mobile phones must not be used or visible around the school
- Earbuds/Headphones must not be used or visible around the school
- Coats must not be worn around the school.

A tailored jacket must be worn at all times and is a compulsory part of the Sixth Form dress code.
