## **Year 11 Raising Achievement Programme**

Year 11 have made an excellent start to the academic year. There is a palpable focus in lessons, with students approaching their studies with real intention and purpose.

Session 6 has been running Monday—Thursday, and the response has been outstanding, with 50+ students attending each night—so much so that we've had to create additional seating! It has been great to see so many students engaging in *cognitively active revision* (such as past papers and practice questions), which provides a real challenge and significantly impacts memory and understanding compared to more passive, 'comfort' revision.

Keep it up, Year 11—your hard work now will pay dividends later in the year.

Motivating Word Learning



Tips to Promote Reading at Home

UNESCO's International Day of Literacy last week highlighted the essential role of reading and writing in children's learning, daily lives and future success.

Literacy is a cornerstone of education, beginning when children are introduced to phonics, and as they continue to develop reading, writing and speaking skills with greater fluency and confidence.

As **parents and carers**, it's natural to **feel** a sense of **responsibility to support** children's **literacy at home**, and ensure that they are making steady progress at an age-appropriate level.

Tooled Up's resources will help build your knowledge and confidence in this important area.

In this webinar for parents of younger children, language learning expert Professor Kathy Rastle explains the importance of phonics learning and deals with some misconceptions that surround it. Why Phonics Matters: Parents' Questions Answered.

A substantial body of research explores literacy acquisition - the development of reading and writing skills. What motivates young children and teens to expand their vocabulary and why do some struggle with word learning? Our podcast, <u>Professor Krishnan and Professor Ripollés Discuss the Role of Intrinsic Reward in Word Learning</u> explores these key topics.
