Character

We continue to emphasise the ongoing commitment to our Character Programme across the school. This is embedded not only in pastoral activities in tutor time and assemblies but also through the taught curriculum across all subjects. This work is vital in reinforcing our school values of Integrity, Inclusivity, and Independence, as well as other associated character strengths such as resilience, perseverance, and teamwork.

Many of these qualities have been on display this week, particularly during the Year 7 Peak District trip, where students demonstrated support and encouragement to their peers, especially during the long walk! These moments highlight the practical application of character in everyday school life.

Year 11 Raising Achievement Programme

Year 11 have made a strong start this week! In assembly, we recapped key messages around cognitively active revision—including the use of past papers, mark schemes, flashcards, and quizzing—versus more passive strategies like simply taking notes.

Topic lists for the Trial Exams (taking place Monday 24 November – Friday 5 December 2025) will soon be available and sent home.

To inspire consistent effort, we shared this thought-provoking quote in assembly:

"Success is the sum of small efforts, repeated day in and day out."

Parents may find this a useful way to start discussions with your children about the importance of little and often revision and committing to the long game. We also celebrated students who have made an outstanding start, awarding prizes to those with very high attendance at Session 6 and those who have collected the most i-Cards so far. Keep up the excellent work!


