Year 11 Raising Achievement Programme

We continue to see a fantastic turnout at Session 6, our after-school silent revision space for Year 11 students. This calm, focused environment allows students to revise independently and productively.

Students are encouraged to be intentional in their approach — arriving prepared with the materials they need, such as printed past papers or revision notes. The top two most effective methods are:

- Past papers with mark schemes
- Flashcards for regular quizzing

Students are also encouraged to adopt a mixed approach to past paper practice, completing both closed tasks (without notes, testing recall) and open tasks (with notes, linking flashcards to questions). This blend helps strengthen exam technique, understanding, and confidence ahead of the final assessments.



Tooled Up at Ashlyns - resources from Dr Kathy Weston: School PIN 4989

It's Black History Month in the UK, a time to reflect on the achievements and contributions of Black communities throughout the years. While this celebration may be observed at different times around the globe, it's important to recognise that sadly, in today's increasingly divided world, racism, microaggressions and discrimination are still very real experiences for many children and young people.

How can we as parents and carers ensure our children grow up with kindness, tolerance and a deep appreciation for all? One powerful way to foster these qualities is by modelling the behaviour we wish to see and instilling our own children with positive values.

Our resource <u>How to Talk to Children about Racist Language and the Importance of Being Respectful</u> whilst written for parents of primary-age children, is **useful for any parent**. It offers **practical tips to help children become a positive force for change.**

It's crucial that young people feel visually represented and see strong, confident characters from diverse backgrounds in everyday resources and media. Celebrating Race and Ethnicity in Books & Films offers empowering fiction and non-fiction suggestions for children of all ages, helping to build pride, resilience, empathy and compassion.

Ensure older children are crystal clear about what is acceptable and unacceptable behaviour. Can they recognise a microaggression - a subtle, indirect action or comment discriminating against someone in a marginalised group? Let's Talk about Microaggressions outlines why understanding microaggressions matters, the impact that they have, and what we can do to support children in our care.

#So.Me

The project #So.Me will develop (PSHE) resources for secondary schools, with a specific focus on social media and mental health. This project aims to create relevant and effective resources that address the real experiences young people have on social media.

As a vital part of the work, the researchers plan to hold an online round table discussion with a small group of parents and teachers of key stage 3 & 4 pupils. The discussion will focus on exploring the barriers adults face in supporting young people with their social media use.
