

Tooled Up at Ashlyns - resources from Dr Kathy Weston: School PIN 4989

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is the science of creating machines and computer systems that can perform tasks that usually require human intelligence.

From voice assistants like Siri and Alexa, to personalised recommendations on Netflix or YouTube, it may be surprising to realise that Al is already part of our everyday lives and many children and young people are engaging with it in various ways, whether to help with homework or to talk to it as a friend.

The pace of change can feel bewildering but Tooled Up has a number of resources designed to help you navigate this important topic.

As Al becomes an integral part of life, children and young people have a unique opportunity to explore and benefit from its possibilities. Our guide Everyday Al: Transforming How We Live and Interact offers a glimpse into its workings, including how we already are, and could, utilise it.

With many children now using Al Chatbots for learning, companionship and as a confidante, it's important to ensure that they don't replace trusted relationships or real-life experiences. Al Chatbots: What Parents Need to Know provides practical support to help parents guide young people to use them safely.

How are children engaging with generative AI and what do they need to stay safe, informed and empowered?
